

**Information about our Pro Bono Clinic & Pro Se Classes:**

St. Johns County Legal Aid, in conjunction with the St. Johns County bar association staffs a legal advice clinic once per month. You must have an appointment to attend the advice clinic. The pro bono volunteer attorneys who staff the clinic give free legal advice and consultations to all participants. After the advice clinic is over each case is discussed by the participating attorneys to determine which cases will be accepted for full representation.

All participants in the clinic get a letter from Legal Aid 7 to 10 days following the clinic to let them know the status their application, such as: advice only, accepted for further advice, accepted for full representation, or accepted to be on a list of cases that we try to refer to pro bono attorneys who did not staff the clinic.

The pro bono clinic advises on all civil (non-criminal) legal matters, not limited to the priority areas of legal aid. If you would like to attend one of our pro bono clinics, please feel free to call for an appointment. When the appointment is made you will be asked intake/screening questions regarding your income and assets, so the pro bono attorneys will have that information when speaking with you. There is also a Pro Se Class available for assistance with legal forms.

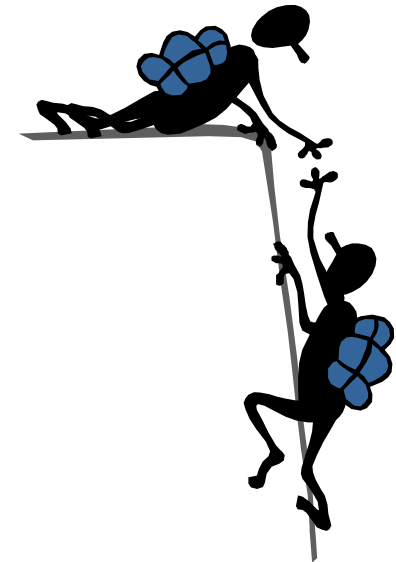
