KEYNOTE SPEAKER

The Honorable Jorge Labarga Chief Justice of the Florida Supreme Court

Jorge Labarga was born in Cuba in 1952. He is married to Zulma R. Labarga, and they have two daughters. He arrived in the United States at the age of 11 where he initially lived with his family in Pahokee, Florida. He graduated from Forest Hill High School in West Palm Beach in 1972 and received his B.A. (1976) and J.D. (1979) from the University of Florida.

Justice Labarga began his legal career in 1979 as an Assistant Public Defender with the Public Defender's Office in West Palm Beach, assigned to the appellate, misdemeanor and felony trial divisions.



In 1982 he joined the State Attorney's Office in West Palm Beach, where he tried cases ranging from theft to homicide. In 1987 he joined the firm of Cone, Wagner, Nugent, Roth, Romano & Ericksen, P.A., and specialized in personal injury trial work. In 1992 Justice Labarga participated in founding the law firm of Roth, Duncan & Labarga, P.A., in West Palm Beach, where he continued to specialize in personal injury litigation and criminal defense.

Governor Lawton Chiles appointed Justice Labarga to the Circuit Court of the Fifteenth Judicial Circuit, in and for Palm Beach County, in 1996. In that capacity he served in the family, civil and criminal divisions. He also served as the administrative judge of the civil division.


In December 2008 Justice Labarga was appointed by Governor Charlie Crist to the Fourth District Court of Appeal. On January 1, 2009, he was appointed by Governor Crist to the Florida Supreme Court, where he presently sits as the 84th Justice to take office at the Florida Supreme Court since statehood was granted in 1845. On June 30, 2014, he was sworn in as the 56th Chief Justice of Florida — the first person of Hispanic descent to lead the state judicial branch.

EQUAL JUSTICE AWARD HONOREES



William "Bill" Sheppard

Sheppard, White, Kachergus, & DeMaggio, P.A.

Throughout his career, William J. Sheppard, has been a vocal and active champion of the work of JALA. A board certified criminal trial lawyer who has established a reputation as a preeminent criminal defense, civil rights and appellate attorney during his nearly 50 years practicing law by committing both himself and his practice to his clients' cases. Throughout his career, he has fought at every level of the judicial system for individuals' protections against violations of their rights and he has litigated virtually every type of criminal case,

from death penalty cases to complex white collar defense.

His pursuit of the vindication of his clients' rights has resulted in his having argued before the United States Supreme Court on three different occasions. Because of such accomplishments, Mr. Sheppard has been recognized by his peers through many accolades, including being chosen as "Lawyer of the Year" three times.

His accomplishments have been further recognized by his appointments to membership on the Florida Governor's Advisory Committee on Corrections, the Middle District of Florida Civil Justice Reform Act Commission, and a term as chair for the Judicial Nominating Commission for the Fourth Judicial Circuit of Florida. He also received the Florida Bar Foundation Medal of Honor, which is the highest honor bestowed upon a lawyer by the legal profession in Florida, the Tobias Simon Pro Bono Award, and countless other local, state, national, and international recognitions.



Samuel S. Jacobson

Mr. Jacobson served two terms as JALA Board President in 1971 and 1998. His work with JALA includes assisting those whose homes were being foreclosed during the housing foreclosure crisis in 2008. He is frequently engaged for complex cases, both civil and family. He has won recognition in ratings by Jacksonville lawyers in both areas. His clients in all areas come to him largely by referral from other lawyers. He has represented lawyers, law firms, and judges, as well as clients referred by them.

Mr. Jacobson is a native of Sanford, Florida. His undergraduate education was at Duke University and his law school training at Duke Law School. Upon completion of law school he began his practice of law as an Assistant United States Attorney in Jacksonville. He has been in private practice in Jacksonville since 1965.

Mr. Jacobson is a member of The Florida Bar and of the bars of the Middle District, United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit, and the Supreme Court of the United States. He is a fellow of the American College of Trial Lawyers and is a master attorney of the Family Inns of Court. He has been included in the BEST LAWYERS OF AMERICA in three areas: family law, white collar criminal defense and personal injury.

Mr. Jacobson loves practicing law. He believes that one of the greatest blessings in his life was the decision to become a lawyer.

OUTSTANDING PRO BONO SERVICE AWARDS

Pro Bono Efforts Cross International Borders

The pro bono team that agreed to represent a Japanese-speaking mother included **Barry L. Zisser** (Zisser Law PLLC), **Kathleen Meagher Krak** (Shutts & Bowen LLP, Orlando office) **Maxine Master Long** (Shutts & Bowen L L P, Coral Gables office)

William Stephen Graessle (William S. Graessle PA). In spite of significant hurdles, this team reunited a mother and child across international borders. At the start of the case, JALA family attorney, Jennifer Jerome, was involved with a motion to change custody in an emergency pick up order with the grandmother. Zisser and Graessle offered their services to assist in getting a rehearing and possibly appealing the case. During the time of their work, the mother returned to Japan and the client relationship ended. However, the Japanese attorneys with whom Jerome had contact assisted the client in filing a petition with the Hague Convention. Krak and Long offered their pro bono services to the client through the Hague Convention Network. The challenges of this case included language barriers and great geographic distances. Armed with the protections of Florida law and the Hague Convention, Krak and Long prevailed at trial and the baby and mother were reunited in Japan earlier this year. The work of this pro bono team is an inspiring example of collaboration in our local, state, and global legal community on behalf of the vulnerable and voiceless.

Pro Bono Lobbying Efforts Impact Health and Safety of Tenants

When JALA began working with tenants of the Eureka Gardens low-income housing complex in 2016 to ensure safe habitability, it wasn't difficult to enlist the assistance of

Howard Lykins Dale and Ann R. Shorstein. A significant problem tenants faced was a lack of air flow as most tenants live without air conditioning, ceiling fans or screen doors. Dale proposed that a simple amendment to Jacksonville's Code to require screen doors in rental housing could offer an inexpensive solution to the lack of air flow while limiting entry of disease -carrying mosquitoes and other insects. Shorstein joined the effort. The pro bono team made the case to members of the City Council and were able to secure a sponsor for the proposed amendment in Jacksonville's Code. Shorstein's and Dale's expertise in working with City government and their commitment to low-income clients provided the formula for success. Jacksonville's Code was amended and all tenants of rental housing living without air conditioning will have a screen door to let in fresh air. The pro bono work of Shorstein and Dale has improved the quality of life of hundreds of families in our community.

Clay and Nassau Pro Bono Initiatives Impact Hundreds

Shortly after JALA started the family law group information clinics in Duval County, **Lisa A. Dasher** (Clay County) and **Valerie C. Faltemier** (Nassau County) spearheaded efforts in their respective counties to provide the service in venues accessible to persons in their areas. The family law group information clinics are offered monthly and serve persons faced with filing their own family law matters with information and forms. Dasher and Faltemier, started their respective clinics five years ago and continue to serve as the administrators of the resource making arrangements with the venues, ensuring packets are available, recruiting other pro bono attorneys, and serving as the attorney presenters on clinic nights. In addition, they each accept clients for representation and serve as expert resource persons for new pro bono attorneys. The impact of Dasher and Faltemier in Clay and Nassau counties has far reaching positive impact on countless families.

OUTSTANDING PRO BONO SERVICE AWARDS

St. Johns County Pro Bono Attorneys Protect the Rule of Law

Jay S. Grife and Donato Joseph Rinaldi have served as part of the volunteer backbone at the St. Johns County Consumer Pro Bono program for years. Grife and Rinaldi interview clients, participate in group case review sessions, and accept cases for full representation each and every month. In addition, both attorneys generously mentor other members of the bar who are interested in accepting consumer cases, but who may not have the experience necessary to handle the case on their own. The efforts of these two pro bono attorneys have resulted in significant victories for their clients both at the trial and appellate levels. One example, is Rinaldi's recent Fifth DCA victory protecting the rights of our veterans in foreclosure cases. Their pro bono efforts are invaluable to other consumer advocates statewide and across the country who are fighting to protect their clients' rights.

Pro Bono Support for NFMLP Focuses on Special Needs Individuals

In 2012, the **CSX Law Department** responded to a request to consider assisting with the increase in guardian advocacy cases being referred to the Northeast Florida Medical Legal Partnership, a project of JALA. The clients were family members of special needs young people. The CSX attorneys responded with enthusiasm to the request. Some corporate legal departments focus only on the barriers to offering pro bono assistance in their communities: attorneys licensed only in other states and practice areas outside their areas of expertise. CSX Law Department overcame these barriers by pairing Florida licensed attorneys with out-of-state attorneys. Leading the effort were Erin O'Brien and Cathy Hilf. The staff in the Law Department requested training in guardian advocacy and ongoing support as needed. These simple steps enabled the CSX in-house attorneys and support staff to begin assisting families in need of guardian advocacy assistance. For five years the CSX Law Department has accepted cases and provided stability for families in need. For families faced with the challenges of caring for a loved one with disabilities these attorneys have eliminated one source of stress.

Landlord/Tenant Pro Bono Project Results in Assistance and Training

In the spring of 2016, Steve Brust and James Cummings of the Jacksonville office of the law firm Smith, Gambrell & Russell, LLP, came to JALA to brainstorm ways that the firm could be more involved in assisting low-income persons with civil legal matters. Their goal was to offer all of their attorneys and especially their newer associates an opportunity in which they would help fill a gap in existing legal services, assist clients, and provide representation experience that could involve appearances in court. What developed was the Landlord/Tenant Pro Bono Project. The attorneys received two training sessions: Landlord/Tenant Intake and Resolving Common Landlord/Tenant Legal Matters. The firm committed to staffing Landlord/Tenant Intake on one afternoon every month and to identifying one or two pro bono cases for full assistance and representation. Brust states, "We are finding that the program has been invaluable in teaching our young lawyers how to interact with members of the community and assist with solving problems. We hope to be able to perform this service for years to come." The need for landlord/tenant assistance is immense, but often difficult because of time sensitive matters. The participation of the pro bono attorneys in intake means that more meritorious cases will receive representation. Families are more likely to avoid a wrongful eviction, children avoid the possibility of changing schools, credit reports aren't damaged. The positive impacts on the family and on the community are immeasurable and are a direct result of the work of Smith, Gambrell & Russell.
